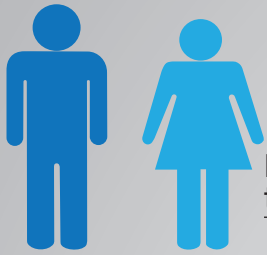


What do Scottish LTCF look like?

Characteristics

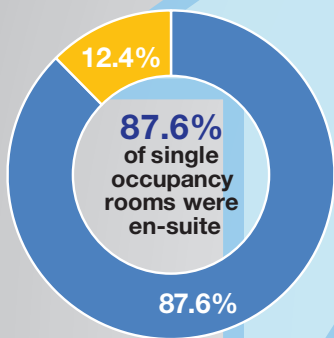


Female to male ratio **2:1**

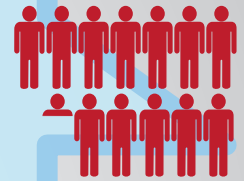
The median age of residents was **84** years

99.2%

of rooms were single occupancy



There were **12.2** WTE registered nurses per 100 beds



There were **61.4** WTE registered care assistants per 100 beds



Data from **2147** eligible residents in **52** care homes, where the average LTCF size was **51** beds

80.0% of LTCF provide IPC training of nursing and care staff

76.5% of LTCF get external IPC advice from local HPT

29.4% of LTCF get IPC advice from hospital IPCT

Disorientation	70.4
Incontinence	66.9
Wheelchair user or bedridden	49.6
Admitted to hospital (3 months)	8.7
Urinary catheter	8.5
Other wounds	7.2
Pressure sore	3.5
Surgery (30 days)	0.3
Vascular catheter	0.1

100% of LTCF have written protocols for HH

82.7% of LTCF have ABHR available for HH

15.4% of LTCF reported ABHR was most frequently used method of HH
