Survey of Local Authorities: driver training in occupied wheelchair transportation in taxis and private hire cars

Background

IRIC continue to receive adverse incident reports where occupied wheelchairs tip over in taxis in transit resulting in injury to the wheelchair user. There is a concern that some taxi drivers are not trained in the safe carriage of occupied wheelchairs. A number of local authorities are addressing this concern with mandatory training for taxi drivers, including a practical test on mobility and wheelchair assistance, as part of the licencing requirement.

This Safety Information Message is raising awareness of the need for taxi driver training in occupied wheelchair carriage and is surveying local authorities to confirm the steps they are currently taking, or plan to take, in this regard.

Reference is made in particular to <u>SQA Certificate in Introduction to the Role of the Professional Taxi and Private Hire Driver at SCQF level 5</u> which some local authorities are adopting which includes a practical test on the safe transportation of passengers who use a wheelchair. IRIC are not endorsing any particular training course and there may be other courses and training methods available.
