BACKGROUND	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The National Stoma Quality Improvement Short Life Working Group (NSQIG) was commissioned by the NHS Scotland Executive Nurse Director Group (SEND) in February 2018 with sub group scoping work complete March 2019 • The Scottish Deputy Nurse Director Group (SDNDF) nominated a chair and vice chair to provide governance and leadership to the work of NSQIG. • NP provided funding for analyst and GP sessional support • NSQIG membership includes regional Stoma Nurse representation, Health Board prescribing support, pharmacy, G.P representatives, Colorectal Surgeon, procurement and prescribing analyst support. • Wider engagement was established with Directors of Pharmacy, Health Board Stoma Fora and commercial partners. / dispensing contractors: (BHTA & CPS) • The aim of NSQIG was to identify, prioritise and progress areas of work requiring a national “Once for Scotland” approach, complementing NHS Boards stoma quality and efficiency activities aligned to key NHS Scotland Health and Social Care policy documents, highlighted within the NSQIG report. • The report and recommendations were approved by NSQIG steering group September 2019.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NSQIG Chair, Craig Stewart has presented the report to SEND in November 2019, who ratified the report in December 2019 following very minor amendments. • Craig Stewart will be presenting the report to Scottish Deputy Nurse Directors Group early February 2020 • NSS Nurse Director will take the SEND ratified report to Fiona McQueen Chief Nursing Officer (CNO) early February 2020. • CNO will forward the ratified report to Rosemarie Parr, Chief Pharmaceutical Officer (CPO), following review by primary pharmacy group. • NSS Pharmacy Director, Ewan Morrison is positioning the report with key pharmacy groups. • Ewan has taken the ratified report to the Director of Pharmacy Executive Group (DoP) & Scottish Pharmacy & Prescribing Advisors Group (SP3AA) prior to review by Chief Pharmaceutical Officer (CPO). • NHS National Services (NSS) Chief Executive has approved publication of the report via NSS.
